From early 2025, the Safety Incentive Rebate Scheme, offering three different rebate options, will provide financial assistance to residents to improve the level of security within their home and community.\*

### Security Incentive Rebate Scheme

Rebate: up to \$250 per household

The Security Incentive Rebate Scheme encourages residents to improve the security on their property through the installation of a range of eligible security devices. The aim is to deter and reduce intrusions, burglaries, theft, and property damage within the city.

Applicants can install multiple security items in their property.



## Register your public facing CCTV to WA Police CAM-MAP

Rebate: a one-off payment of \$50

This platform allows owners and operators of CCTV systems to register onto a secure database operated by the Western Australia Police Force. This register will assist police to locate public facing cameras quickly during investigations, help with the collection of CCTV evidence and respond more effectively to incidents as they arise, ultimately enhancing public safety.



#### Safe and Found WA

**Rebate:** \$99 towards to cost of the first year sign up\*

Safe and Found WA supports people living with dementia, autism or a cognitive impairment who might be at risk of becoming lost or reported as missing, by ensuring Police have immediate access to critical information to assist when undertaking search operations.

This is an initiative introduced by the Western Australia Police Force and Australia Medic Alert Foundation.
